

Awana Parents Guide



Thank you for enrolling your child in ACC's Awana Club ministry. We are pleased to partner with you in the development of your child's character, values, and moral foundation in Christ.

Awana Club

Awana is an acronym for "Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed", taken from 2 Timothy 2:15 in the Bible. Our goal is to lead boys and girls to Christ, and to train them to serve Him all their lives.

Awana is a four-part program designed to maximize your child's attention, energy, and time.

Part 1: Flag Ceremony

This is the opening time when all children gather together for the Awana pledge and theme song. It's also a time to introduce visitors, recognize birthdays and make announcements.

Part 2: Small Group Time (Handbook time)

This is a small group experience facilitated by an adult leader to help guide your child through the handbook.

Part 3: Game / Activity Time

This is a time to develop team skills because learning to work together as a team is a valuable life skill. Sportsmanship is more highly prized than winning, so your child will be learning how to lose as well as how to win with a gracious spirit.

Part 4: Large Group Time (Council time)

This is an interactive large group time between an adult leader and your child's club. A biblical lesson will be presented, and clubbers will discover how to apply that message to their daily lives.

Clubs

Cubbies: Ages 3-4

"Cubbies celebrates the spiritual potential of preschoolers by helping them develop respect for God, His Son and His Word."



Sparks: Kindergarten to Grade 2

"Sparks ignites the curiosity of early elementary-age kids to learn about the people and events of the Bible, building a foundation of wisdom for knowing Christ."



T&T: Grades 3-6

"The T&T (Truth & Training) curriculum teaches kids the truth of God's Word, trains them to follow Him and practice His grace."



Helping Your Child Succeed

Parents are the most important part of a child's spiritual development. Awana exists to encourage and empower you to be the primary faith builder of your child, to help your child grow and mature in their faith. We encourage you to be a part of our ACC family if you do not have a church home. Please support your child by looking through their Awana handbooks, helping them memorize Bible verses before club night, and helping them understand what those verses mean.



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Parent Participation

In order for your child to succeed in their spiritual growth and learn how to serve the Body of Christ, parents of clubbers should participate in Awana as volunteers or as Awana leaders. When parents model a servant's heart, your child is more likely to serve as they grow older. Parent participation is part of the child's Awana registration. Many current Awana leaders have been serving for many years and there are not enough leaders for the number of clubbers that are usually enrolled.

Parent Orientation

There will be a parent orientation on **Friday, August 30 at 7:30 PM on Zoom**. This is mandatory for parents of first-time Awana clubbers. We will go over expectations for the upcoming Awana year. For parent participation, parents can sign up for different dates and for different clubs during orientation or on the first night of Awana. If you cannot participate in your child's club, please contact the Awana Commander to discuss.

Courtesy Reminders

If you arrive at a Club night after the Flag Ceremony has started, please DO NOT open the doors and send your child in. They need to wait quietly outside until a leader opens the door for them. Parents, please do not stand outside the Awana doors and talk; it is disruptive to our younger clubbers. Please go to your own meeting room or to a seating area to visit with one another.

Completion and Other Achievements

Handbooks

Each child is required to complete at least 1 section of a handbook each week. However, to fully complete a handbook, each clubber will need to complete more than 2 sections a week to finish before the end of the Awana year. Previous handbooks must be completed before clubbers can advance to the next handbook.







Extra Credit

Extra credit work is assigned AFTER all handbooks and reviews have been completed. If clubbers complete the extra credit, additional extra credit work will be assigned to them.

Perfect/Best Attendance

Perfect or Best Attendance is acknowledged for clubbers who did not miss a single club night or missed only 1 night in the Fall and/or 1 night in the Spring. Missing club nights due to inclement weather will not be counted.

Character Recognition

Character Recognition celebrates the different gifts and efforts of every clubber and encourages them to use God's gifts in their lives. Attitude, sportsmanship, preparedness, improvement, outreach, hospitality, etc. are all factors that are recognized. Awana leaders will identify at least one specific characteristic of each child and encourage the child to use that gift in serving others. The characteristic will also be recognized during the Awana Awards Ceremony.



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T&T 6th Grade Student Leader

Purpose: Children who get a chance to serve are more likely to see God working in their lives, thus strengthening their faith at an early age. By serving and leading others during their preteen years, children will hopefully build a foundation of service as they move up into the Youth group.

This optional Student Leader program allows 6th Graders to develop leadership skills and serve their peers. For the first 2 months of Awana, the 6th Grader must prove their qualifications in order to serve. The program will be discussed individually with the 6th Grader and his/her parents.

Student Leadership Details

- Clubbers must have completed 3 T&T handbooks by the time the 4th year begins.
- Clubbers must be able to keep up with their handbooks each week with little supervision.
- Clubbers must sign a Student Leader covenant with guidelines.
- If candidates are able to meet all of the expectations of the covenant and guidelines in the first 2 months of the Awana year, they will be promoted to Student Leaders on the 3rd month.
- Clubbers can serve various roles like helping T&T, Sparks & Cubbies leaders in reciting verses, leading games, flag ceremony duties, clean up, etc.
- Student Leaders will report to the Awana Commander and assist Club Leaders.

Awana Awards Ceremony

Our annual **Awana Awards Ceremony** will be held on Friday, **May 16, 2025**. **Parents should attend this event.** This is an important event as your children will have their achievements recognized. We are proud of your child's hard work and they need to know that **YOU** are proud of them also. Clubbers must complete their handbooks the week before the awards ceremony.
